Keynote: Mike Pond Overview of Addiction



Mike Pond is a Vancouver-based psychotherapist specializing in addiction treatment. Thirty years of practice combined with his own battle with an Alcohol Use Disorder convinced Mike that harm

reduction, using evidence-based scientific treatment delivered with compassion, can be transformative. Pond received his Masters Degree in Social Work from the University of British Columbia in 1995. He worked in Forensic Psychiatric Services and Mental Health and Addictions Services for the British Columbia Government and for Health Canada and the First Nations Health Authority. He began private practice in 1995. He's an avid blogger, in-demand speaker and informed advocate for better addictions and mental health treatment.

Mr. Pond's presentations will focus on familial traits in addiction, and new psychological and medical treatments for addiction.

His primary interest is in computer-delivered assessment and motivational interventions for substance use and other risk factors among pregnant and postpartum women.
